Dr Penny Tisdall graduated from the University of Sydney with a BSc(Vet) for studies on portosystemic shunts in dogs in 1992 and with a BVSc in 1994. After working in private practice she returned to the University of Sydney to complete a Small Animal Surgical Residency. She has completed a Clinical Masters in aspects of feline megacolon and has contributed to over 25 published papers Penny obtained Fellowship of the Australian College of Veterinary Scientists in 2002 by examination. Penny worked exclusively in referral surgical practice for 15 years In this time she has run a successful surgical internship programme that has been the springboard for several interns into residency and specialisation.
