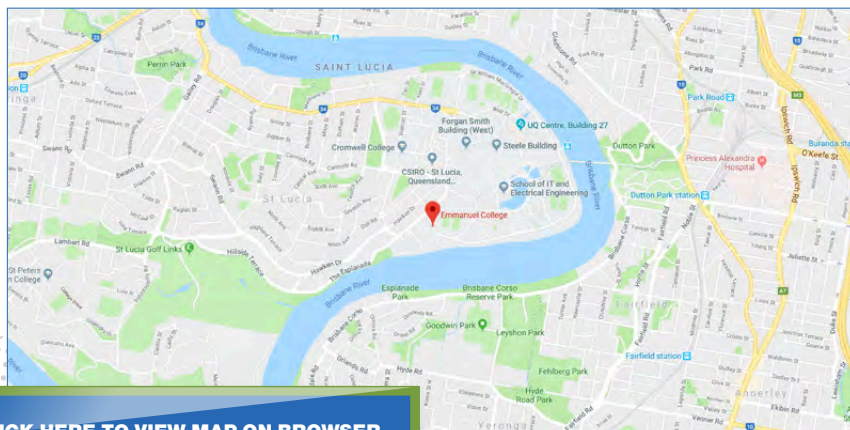

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Dr Chris Zink is a consultant in canine sports medicine and rehabilitation and the author of several books on the subject. She is co-editor of the textbook Canine Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation with Dr. Van Dyke. Dr. Zink was one of 13 veterinarians who founded one of the latest specialties in veterinary medicine, the American College of Veterinary Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation, of which she is currently the President. Dr. Zink has been lecturing nationally and internationally on canine sports medicine and rehabilitation for over 25 years and her teaching style is widely acclaimed. She was named 2009 Outstanding Woman Veterinarian of the Year and continues part-time as a Professor at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine where she helps train veterinarians.

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A graduate of the University of Illinois College of Veterinary Medicine. Janet completed her internship and surgical residency at the Animal Medical Center in New York City in 1984. Practicing orthopedics and sports medicine, Dr. Van Dyke saw many canine patients that could benefit from rehabilitation therapy. In 2002, she founded the Canine Rehabilitation Institute, Inc. Dr. Van Dyke lectures nationally and internationally and consults regularly with state veterinary and physical therapy boards and societies on legislature issues related to veterinary rehabilitation. Janet is the co-author of the widely acclaimed textbook "Canine Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation". Dr. Van Dyke is an affiliate faculty member in the Department of Clinical Sciences at Colorado State University's College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences.

Dr Esther Horton graduated with Honours as a Veterinarian from the University of Queensland in 1989. Esther's interest in Acupuncture and Integrative therapies was stimulated by the inability of Conventional Medicine to address many chronic diseases, such as osteo-arthritis. She is passionate about pain management for her small animals patients. Esther is a Certified Veterinary Acupuncturist with the International Veterinary Acupuncture Society (IVAS), and a Certified Canine Rehabilitation Therapist through the Canine Rehabilitation Institute (CRI). She has completed courses in Traditional Chinese Veterinary Herbal medicine, Food therapy, Myofascial Pain and Trigger Point therapy, Small Animal Pain Management and Chinese Massage/Tui Na. Esther is a Board Member of the Australian Veterinary Palliative Care Advisory Council and a registered Practitioner Member of the Australian Canine Rehabilitation Association. Esther is currently a tutor and examiner for the Australian College of Veterinary Acupuncture and Trigger point therapy courses.
